Award for Ojas Foundation founder

CHENNAI: S. Tatwamasi Dixit, founder of Ojas Foundation, has been conferred the Maharishi Badrayan Vyas Samman Award by the President of India.

A letter from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, says the award will be given to him for his interdisciplinary studies involving the contribution of Sanskrit and ancient Indian wisdom to the synergy created by modernity and tradition.

Educated in the Vedas and Sastras since childhood, the 33-year-old studied at the Banaras Hindu University.

"The Vedas and Upanishads are not just a means to self-realisation, but a scientific treatise on life, health and management," Mr. Dixit said, talking to *The Hindu*.

Taking up the challenge of bringing the essence of the Vedas to the modern world, the founder and managing director of Ojas Foundation undertook the task in three ways — through research, treatment and counselling. His efforts resulted in four CDs on Vedic chants. The fifth CD on chants to cure hypertension will be released in January.
